PROCLAMATION NUMBER 185 JBE 2018

STATE OF EMERGENCY – RIVER FLOODING

- WHEREAS,** the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act, La. R.S. 29:721, *et seq.*, confers upon the Governor of the State of Louisiana emergency powers to deal with emergencies and disasters, including those caused by fire, flood, earthquake or other natural or manmade causes, in order to ensure that preparations of this State will be adequate to deal with such emergencies or disasters and to preserve the lives and property of the people of the State of Louisiana;
- WHEREAS,** when the Governor determines that a disaster or emergency has occurred, or the threat thereof is imminent, La. R.S. 29:724(B)(1) empowers the Governor to declare a state of emergency by executive order or proclamation, or both;
- WHEREAS,** due to severe weather in the state and north of the state, river gauges on the Mississippi River, Ouachita River, and Atchafalaya River exceed the flood stage and are expected to remain so for the next few weeks;
- WHEREAS,** many parishes along the Mississippi River, Ouachita River and Atchafalaya River need to take protective measures to help mitigate possible flooding; and
- WHEREAS,** six parishes have declared an emergency including Catahoula, Concordia, East Carroll, Madison, Tensas, and Terrebonne.


NOW THEREFORE, I, JOHN BEL EDWARDS, Governor of the State of Louisiana, by virtue of the authority vested by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Louisiana, do hereby order and direct as follows:

- SECTION 1:** Pursuant to the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act, La. R.S. 29:721 *et seq.*, a state of emergency is hereby declared to exist as a result of severe weather, the effects of which continue to threaten the lives and property of the citizens of the State in the parishes of Catahoula, Concordia, East Carroll, Madison, Tensas, and Terrebonne.
- SECTION 2:** The Director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness is hereby authorized to undertake any activity authorized by law which he deems appropriate in response to this declaration.
- SECTION 3:** All departments, commissions, boards, agencies and officers of the State, or any political subdivision thereof, are authorized and directed to

cooperate in actions the State may take in response to the effects of this severe weather event.

SECTION 4: This order is effective upon signature and shall remain in effect from Wednesday, December 26, 2018 until Thursday, January 24, 2019, unless terminated sooner.
