

MAJOR ECONOMIC IMPACTS

of **MEDICAID EXPANSION**

The Louisiana Department of Health commissioned Dr. Jim Richardson and the Public Affairs Institute at Louisiana State University to conduct an independent analysis of the impact of Medicaid expansion on Louisiana's economy. We know expansion saves the state money - **\$317 million in savings** to date. But what about the indirect effects from the massive influx of federal funds in terms of job creation and tax revenue?

The results below speak for themselves—all while over **468,000 people** have received critical services like preventive doctor visits, mammograms, and access to mental health services. Prior to expanding Medicaid, Louisiana was spending approximately 40 cents on the dollar for uninsured care. Under expansion, those costs are capped at 10 cents on the dollar. This combined with added tax revenue from providers contributed to an overall cost savings to the state.
