Dear Administrator Zeldin,

As governors and members of the Governors Coalition for Energy Security (GCES), we would like to commend you on recent actions you have taken to eliminate wasteful federal funding that has gone to support campaigns and other initiatives that would undermine American jobs and economic growth.

The goals of our organization include ensuring continued energy development to meet domestic energy demand, speeding permitting and reducing regulatory barriers to develop necessary energy infrastructure, and appropriately managing energy resources and the environment.
