

2025 Inclusive Art Contest

Theme: Creativity Meets Advocacy - A Tribute to Disability Advocates

In the spirit of the 35th year of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and to bring greater awareness to the importance of inclusion in today's society, the Governor's Office of Disability Affairs (GODA) invites you to participate in the 2025 Inclusive Art Contest. GODA will accept entries that illustrate or describe ideas related to the law which ensures individuals with disabilities have the same rights and opportunities as everyone else by requiring reasonable accommodations and accessibility. Contestants are encouraged to use original art to share their vision, experiences and talents, and tributes to disability advocates to demonstrate this year's theme. A medal and special recognition from Governor Jeff Landry will be presented to the winners. Winning entries will be publicly displayed.

Contest Rules

- Open to ALL residents of Louisiana of any age.
- No group entry will be accepted.
- All entries must be received by Monday, November 3, 2025.
- Winning artwork may not be returned.
- Artwork not selected as winners may be picked up at the GODA office in Baton Rouge. GODA will not be responsible for any entry not picked up by December 31, 2025.
- By submitting your entry, you give GODA permission to use your entry in support of the contest.
- The registration form must be typed or printed legibly in ink, signed, and attached to the back of your entry. (Please do not staple the registration form to your artwork.)
- GODA will not pay for postage due on parcels. Submissions must be mailed with adequate postage.

Criteria for Art Entries

- All entries must be original and framed or ready to hang.
- Submissions must be no larger than 16 x 20 inches. Any suitable materials or computer-generated design may be utilized.
- Entries must be packaged so that they are easy to carry, transport, and display.

Criteria for Written Entries

- All entries must be less than 300 words.
- Entries can be poems, lyrics, essays, speeches, and short stories.
- The entry must be typed or printed legibly.

Contestants are encouraged to use art to share their vision, experiences, and talents to demonstrate "CREATIVITY MEETS ADVOCACY: A Tribute to Disability Advocates." A medal and special recognition from Governor Jeff Landry will be presented to the winners. All Contestants are encouraged to conduct research and educate themselves of the importance of accessibility and inclusion.
