

## EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT PROCLAMATION NUMBER 149 JBE 2022

## LEGAL STATE HOLIDAY – FRIDAY, DECEMBER 23, 2022

- WHEREAS, pursuant to La. R.S. 1:55(A) and (B)(1)(a), Sunday, December 25, 2022, is a legal holiday and a day of rest in the State of Louisiana observed by the departments of the State;
- WHEREAS, Louisiana Revised Statute 1:55(B)(3) empowers the Governor to authorize, by Executive Proclamation, the observance by the departments of the State of other holidays and half-holidays that the Governor deems in keeping with efficient administration; and
- **WHEREAS**, the citizens of the State of Louisiana and the officers and employees of the departments of the State will benefit from an additional legal holiday during a period when families traditionally gather together to remember their blessings and promote family values.

**NOW THEREFORE I, JOHN BEL EDWARDS,** Governor of the State of Louisiana, by virtue of the authority vested by the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, do hereby order and direct as follows:

- **SECTION 1:** Friday, December 23, 2022 is declared a legal holiday in the State of Louisiana and shall be observed as a day of rest.
- **SECTION 2:** Insofar as practicable, the appointing authorities and/or heads of all institutions, offices and departments of the State (hereafter "appointing authority") shall permit the officers and employees under their control to observe Friday, December 23, 2022 as a day of rest. Nonetheless, an appointing authority shall have discretion to require said officers and/or employees to work on the holiday when, in the appointing authority's judgment, it is required for the efficient administration of a state facility, the operation of which is necessary and indispensable to the citizens of the State.
